INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING FORM CJSTC-7

1. Complete form CJSTC-7 for each student.
2. Enter the student's name, identification number, and class number in the space provided.
3. Enter the time the exercise was performed by checking either DAYTIME or NIGHTIME in the space provided.
4. Enter the ATTEMPT number in the space provided.
5. For each RUN of each EXERCISE, place a check mark in the boxes provided for either SATISFACTORY(S) OR UNSATISFACTORY (U) performance. (Refer to Glossary of Evaluation Terms for standards of criteria.)
6. Use the "Comments" section to note any deficiencies in the student's performance. Be specific when making your comments and advise the student where improvements are necessary to achieve a passing score.
7. Place a check mark in the boxes provided for either PASS or FAIL to signify the student's OVERALL performance. A basic recruit student must perform at least three out of four runs with NO errors in order to pass an exercise. A student instructor must perform at least four out of runs with no errors to pass an exercise.
8. Place a check in the "basic recruit" box if the student is a basic recruit. Place a check in the "student instructor" box if the student is a student instructor.
9. Each instructor who evaluates the student is required to sign his or her name on the line next to the exercise that he or she evaluated.
10. The Rangemaster or Lead Instructor is required to sign his or her name at the bottom of the evaluation form.
11. Enter the date the student completed the performance evaluation.
12. Retain the form in the student's file at the training school for documentation purposes.

VEHICLE TO INSTRUCTOR RATIO

For instruction of the Law Enforcement Vehicle Operations Basic Recruit Training Course and Law Enforcement Vehicle Operations Instructor Course, there shall be at least one Commission-certified driving instructor for each vehicle actively engaged plus one rangemaster.

ACTIVELY ENGAGED DEFINED

Actively engaged is defined as a vehicle that is at the point between the start and end of an exercise. Returning from, or being in route to, is not actively engaged. A rangemaster is not required during remediation and re-evaluation provided there is only one vehicle actively engaged in vehicle operations training.

PROFICIENCY QUALIFICATIONS

A basic recruit student shall be required to demonstrate proficiency with three out of four runs (75%) for each exercise. An instructor student shall be required to demonstrate proficiency with four out of five runs (80%) for each exercise
